ESP language training is therefore built on an assessment of purposes and needs and the functions for which English is required.

Course Description

- 1. assess needs effectively and integrate motivation, subject matter and content for the teaching of relevant skills.
- 2. transform learning goals into an instructional program
- 3. help students identify their language learning problems and find solutions to them
- 4. concentrate on language in context rather than solely on teaching grammar and language structures
- 5. integrate technology to promote self study
- 6. create an atmosphere in the language classroom which supports the students
- 7. source and produce effective ESP training materials
